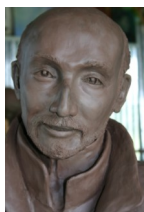

Small Group Reflection for Parents***

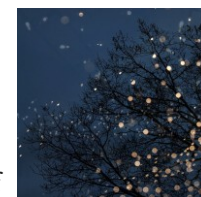

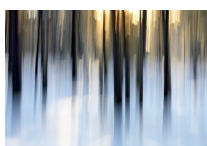

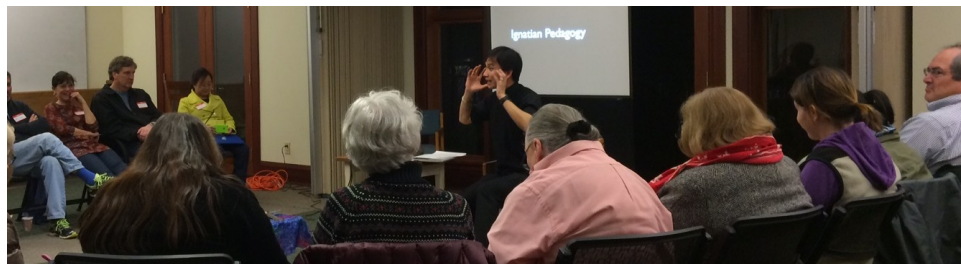
